

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Summary - Force Key Performance Indicators - Key Crime Types

Total recorded crime volumes remain below 2023/2024. This reduction is statistically significant at force level and across all Local Policing Areas (LPAs).

- West Mercia has the fourth lowest volume of crimes within its MSG and is inline with Year to month statistically significant decreases, have been recorded against: the MSG average.
- Year to month statistically significant increases, have been recorded against:
 - Rape South Worcestershire. Whilst volumes have increased on 2023/2024, the proportion of recent/non recent offences has remained similar.
- Violence with Injury Force level and all LPAs apart from South Worcestershire
- Residential Burglary Force level and all LPAs


Upper and Lower Limits



The upper and lower control limits (thresholds) are derived by calculating 2 points of Standard Deviation from the mean. The mean is fixed for the year and is based on volumes recorded previous financial year. Statistical tests have been carried out on the data in order to determine if any change in volume is 'statistically significant'. i.e. likely to be caused by something other than random chance. Significance level is measured at 95%. It is highly likely that year to date decreases are linked to changes in recording practices for Course of Conduct offences and Public Order offences in May 2023.

Yes – Test was statistically significant, and therefore it is likely to be non-random. No – Test was not statistically significant, and therefore it is likely due to random chance. NA – Test could not be completed due\ to volume size.
